They won over the crowd at the 21st annual People's Choice Awards during the Okanagan Fall Wine Festival and took home the first place award for the best Chardonnay (2004 vintage), and the second place award in the Gewurztraminer category for their 2004 Gewurztraminer – Madam's Vines

The judges of the Okanagan Fall Wine Festival were fans of their 2004 Thread Bare Vines and awarded it a bronze medal. Their new label was also a hit, taking home a gold medal at the Annual B.C. Wine Label Awards


